



Picklists are lists of standardized terms for court orders.

Picklists are available on courtroom computers so a court clerk can use them to quickly and accurately capture the order a judge makes. When a judge decides to change the standard wording, a court clerk can edit the term accordingly. Picklists include number codes that help the court clerk find a term quickly. When a judge says a number before making an order, they are helping the clerk find that order.

For example you might hear a judge say "**1106**". This lets the court clerk know that the judge is referring to a term that says "**You must attend each court appearance unless this Court excuses you.**"
