

The Office of the Chief Judge is not a court registry. To request information about a court case or file documents in a court case you must contact the court registry directly. Contact a court registry (Government of BC)

The Office of the Chief Judge is the headquarters of the Court

Under the Chief Judge's direction, the day-to-day operations of the Court are carried out by Integrated Judicial Services employees working at the Office of the Chief Judge and in courthouses across the province. The Office of the Chief Judge, which is the Court's administrative headquarters, is located at the Robson Square courthouse in downtown Vancouver.

The Office of the Chief Judge (OCJ) cannot:

- Provide legal advice
- Comment on specific cases before the courts
- Advise on individual situations
- Change the outcome of a ruling or decision
- Order a new trial, declare a mistrial or overturn a decision
- Permit you to contact, speak with or correspond privately with judges about an ongoing court matter or any decision the judge has made
- Provide information about a court case or court records
- Accept a verbal complaint about the conduct of a judicial officer, you must instead make a written complaint
